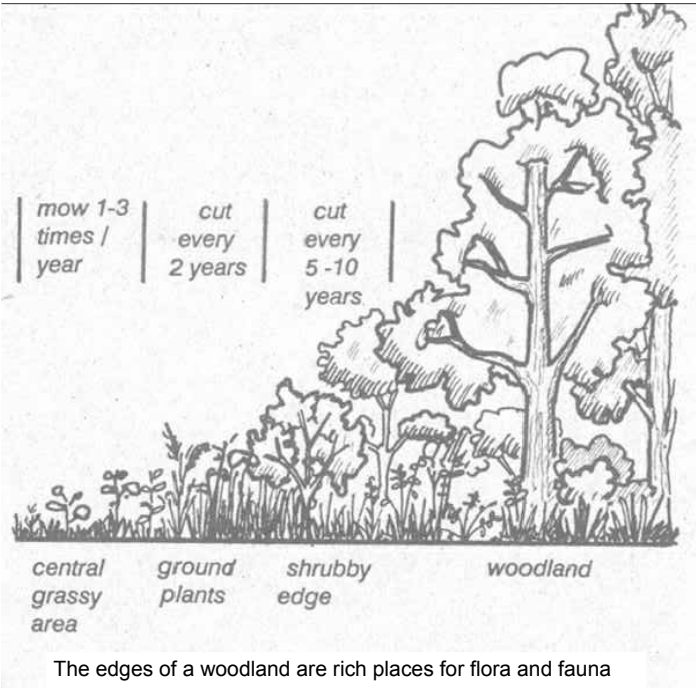


Wood

Lakeside Woodland

- This strip of woodland lies on a North-east facing slope casting long shadows over the lake and every Autumn dropping its leaves to year on year slowly fill the lake with sediment. The woodland has been allowed to become dense with little age variety to the trees.
- It is proposed to thin the trees by as much as 30%, particularly in strips along North-South axis to enable light to penetrate to the lake and the woodland understory. The felled timber will provide for seats and sculpture. Bird and bat boxes together with the planting of low and medium growing, native woodland plants will encourage nesting.



Thinning the canopy will encourage other plants to find their niche and thrive.
